Between each pair of walls, including the borders, place the numbers 1 through n, where n is the length of the space. For example, a single square – one with walls immediately on either side of it – will be filled with a 1. Two-square spaces will be filled with a 1 and 2, and so on. The order of the numbers in the squares is for you to determine.

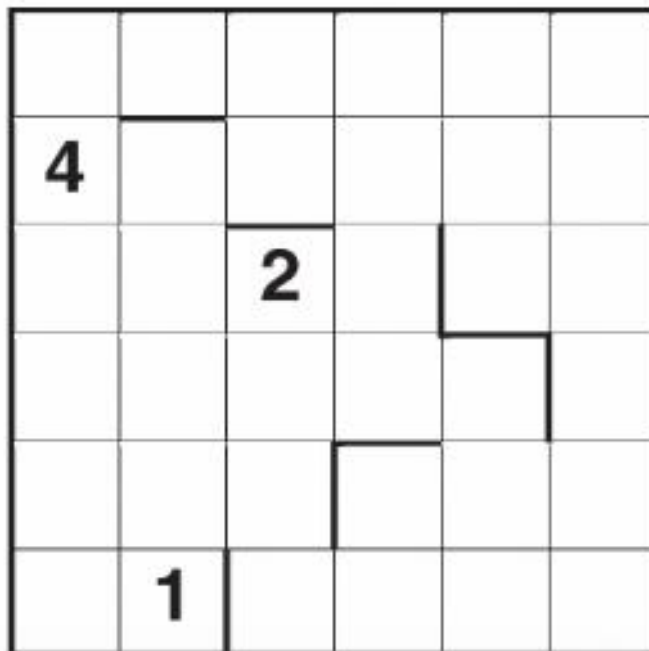
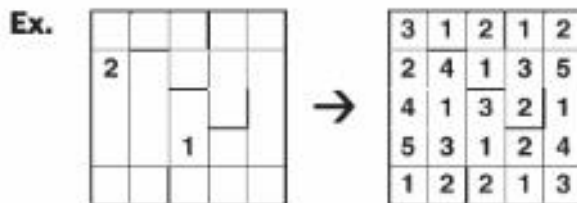
