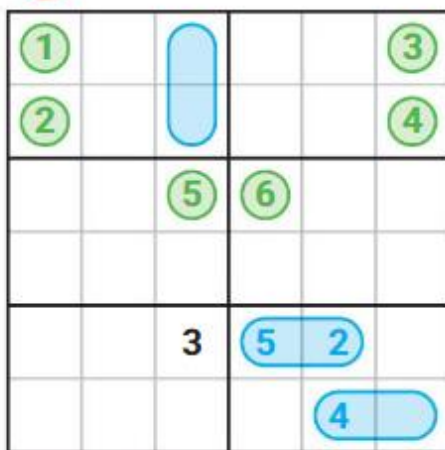
SUDOMINO PUZZLES

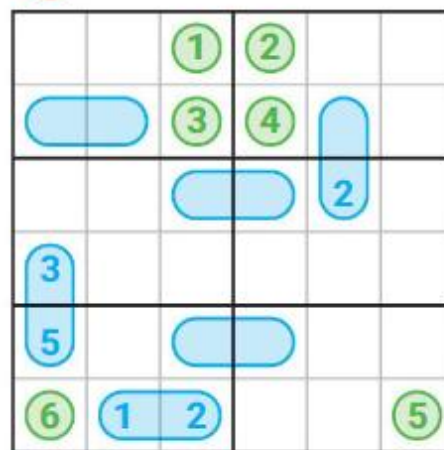

Your goal is to fit them into the grid—using each domino once—so that every row, column, and heavily outlined subsection contains each digit from 1 to 6 exactly once. To start you off, we've shown the single numbers 1 through 6 in circles, placed some dominoes, and shown a few other numbers. Can you do the rest?
