




Your goal in these puzzles is to form familiar four-letter words (proper nouns are allowed) reading across and down in each grid. All of the letters that appear in each puzzle are provided.

These puzzles also incorporate elements of the number logic puzzle known as Skyscrapers. The letters represent buildings in alphabetical order from 1 to 26. (A = 1-floor building, B = 2, C = 3, D = 4, and so on, up to Z = 26.) Arrows indicate how many buildings (letters) you can see from the direction the arrow is pointing. If the same

letter appears in two adjacent squares, only the first of the two can be seen.

Here are a couple of solving hints: Start by placing the tallest buildings in order (last letters of the alphabet among those given). Also, the two words given above each puzzle will be spelled out in the solved puzzle. ANSWERS, PAGE 76



GREATER, LESSER, EQUAL CROSSWORD PUZZLES

In these puzzles, your goal is to fill in the grid with common crossword words reading across and down. All of the letters that appear in each puzzle are shown. In each grid, you will find three types of symbols: greater than (>), lesser than (<), and equals (=). The < symbol means a letter is before another in the alphabet, the > symbol means a letter is after another in the alphabet, and the = indicates that both letters are the same.




